Shabbat Erev Tisha B'Av - Things to Know

← See the schedule on left

- There will not be a 3rd meal in shul this week
- You may eat and drink as regular on Shabbat up until the onset of the fast at sunset. This includes eating a large third meal, including even meat and wine if you'd like
- You must finish all eating and drinking by sunset (8:18pm)
- At sunset, the restriction on washing hands or other parts of the body begins. However, no outward expressions of mourning are allowed until nightfall (9:02pm). Therefore one should not sit on the floor or change out of leather shoes until Shabbat is over
- Shabbat ends at 9:02 pm. Say the words "*Baruch Hamavdil bein kodesh l'chol*", remove leather shoes, change out of Shabbat clothes, and begin practicing all restrictions of Tisha B'Av (e.g. sitting on the floor, refrain from greeting people, etc.)
- We do not say havdala until Sunday night. Only the bracha of Borei m'eorei ha'eish is recited on a candle (this will be done in shul for those in attendance)
- An adult who cannot fast should recite havdala on Saturday night as usual
